THE HISTORIC BUILDINGS PARKS & GARDENS EVENT 2012

This one-day HISTORIC BUILDINGS, PARKS AND GARDENS EVENT, which has been running for over 25 years, is held in parallel with the Historic Houses Association's Annual General Meeting. GUEST SPEAKER – Loyd Grossman OBE

The 2012 HHA Guest speaker will be Loyd Grossman, OBE, Chairman of The Heritage Alliance.

Born in Boston in 1950, Loyd Grossman graduated from Boston University (BA cum laude), the London School of Economics (M Sc Econ) and Magdalene College, Cambridge (MPhil). After starting as a journalist with Harpers & Queen and the Sunday Times he went into television as writer, presenter or deviser of such programmes as Through the Keyhole, MasterChef, Behind the Headlines, History of British Sculpture, Loyd on Location and Build Britain.

Loyd Grossman is actively interested in history, the arts and heritage. He is a former Commissioner of the Museums and Galleries Commission; English Heritage; and the Royal Commission on the Historical Monuments of England; a founding member of the Museums, Libraries and Archives Council and past Chairman of National Museums Liverpool and of the Public Monuments and Sculpture Association. He founded the 24 Hour Museum (now Culture 24); became Patron of the Association for Heritage Interpretation, President of the British Association of Friends of Museums; and a Fellow of St Deiniol's Library. In 2007 he was appointed Chairman of The Churches Conservation Trust, and in 2008 Chairman of the University for the Creative Arts.

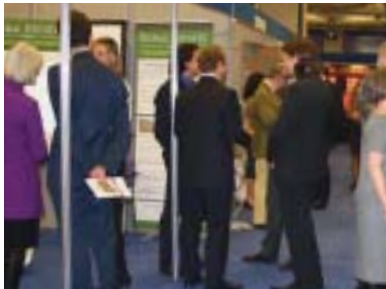
EXHIBITION GUIDE

DISPLAY STAND SPACE INFORMATION



DISPLAY STAND SIZES AND CONSTRUCTION Display stands are available in 6 different sizes, 2m x 1m, 3m x 1m, 2m x 2m, 3m x 2m, 4m x 2m and 5m x 2m. The stand is constructed from panels 2400mm high x 990mm wide. The panels are grey, and material (artwork, photographs and other promotional material) may be fixed only by using male (hook) Velcro. Please note the internal dimension of each stand is 10mm less for every 1m of panelling 4m x 2m (3960mm x 1980mm), 3m x 2m (2970mm x 1980mm), 2m x 1m (1980mm x 990mm). Each stand will have a fascia board bearing the exhibitor's name and stand number in black lettering on a white background. All stands have side panels except corner stands, which do not have an end side wall panel so as to provide maximum access and visibility.

SET-UP TIMES

The stands in areas A, B, C, D, E & F will be ready for occupation by 13.00 on Monday 12 November 2012. Stands in area G may have alternative or restricted set up times due to other events in the building; if this occurs you will be informed of the revised arrangements and given sufficient time to set up. You have until 08.00 on Tuesday 13 November to dress your stand. Exhibitors may prefer to use the period on Monday evening between 18.00 and 22.00 because of traffic conditions in the Victoria Street Parliament Square area and parking restrictions.

POWER AND LIGHTING The price for each stand includes one 13 amp switched socket outlet and either two 100 watt spotlights or one 5' fluorescent fitting.

After we have received your *Application for Stand Space* form we will contact you to confirm your requirements.



REFRESHMENTS The exhibition refreshment area, which will be open on Tuesday 13 November only, includes a cash bar and refreshment facilities offering hot and cold food and a large seating area. Exhibitors are provided free of charge with refreshment vouchers which are valid for use on Tuesday 13 November and can be exchanged for four cups of coffee, available from the exhibition area, and two set meals (main course and sweet) which will be served in an area set aside for the exclusive use of Exhibitors and their staff between 12.30 and 15.00 on Tuesday 13 November only. Additional vouchers for the set meal (main course and

sweet) may be ordered in advance at a cost of £34.00 each inclusive of VAT. No catering facilities will be available at the QEII on Monday 12 November, the set up day, but coffee shops and restaurants are only moments away in Victoria Street.

FLOOR The Exhibition area is carpeted. Exhibitors must protect the carpet when placing heavy items and, where appropriate, exhibits should have a drip tray.

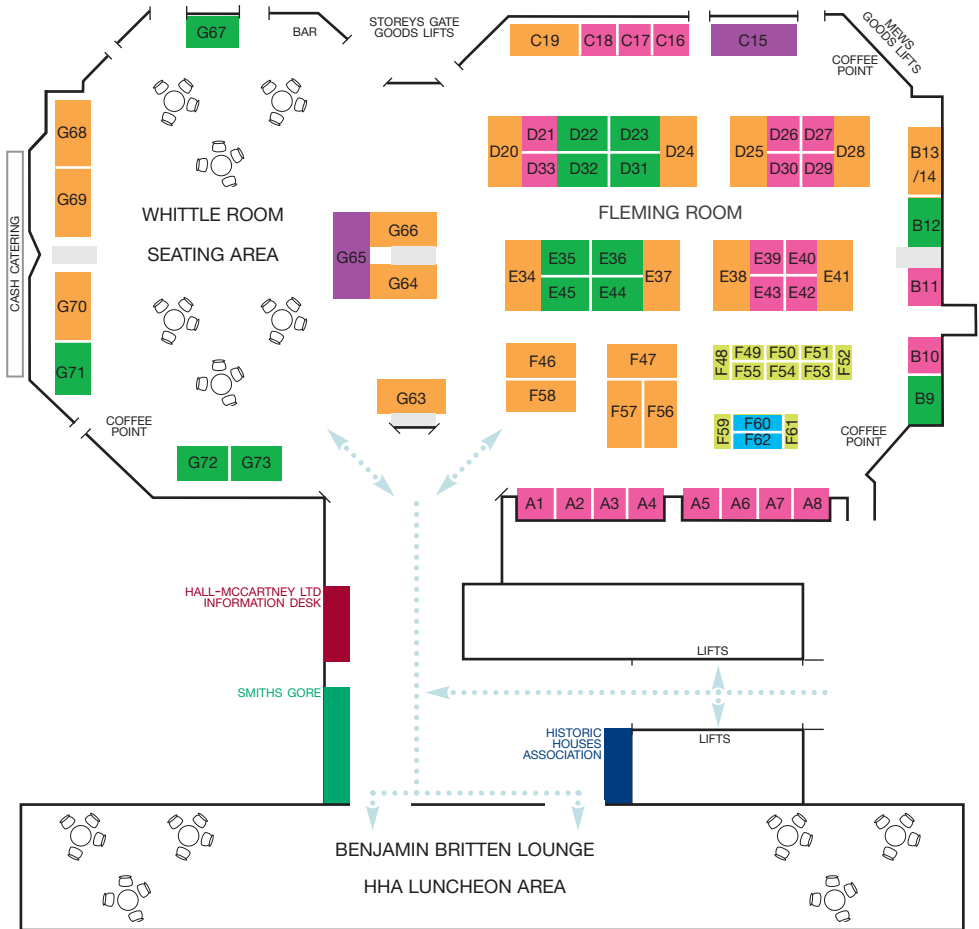
