The exhibition will be of interest to anyone involved in the care, upkeep, repair, restoration and conservation of historic buildings, their contents and associated landscapes.



From the traditional to cutting-edge technology, the exhibition provides visitors with an opportunity to gather information and to discuss such issues as building conservation and repair, carpet restoration, computer systems, estate management, gates, gilding, glasshouses, insurance, interior decoration, ironwork, terracotta, textiles, windows and even vehicles and visitor attractions.



Formed in 1973, the HHA exists to provide practical advice and professional services to the owners of historic houses and to represent them in their effort

to preserve this vital part of our heritage in the interest of the Nation. Two-thirds of Britain's built heritage remains in the hands of private owners and is preserved by them, often at considerable expense. Successive governments have endorsed the private owner as the most economic and effective guardian of the built heritage. Their paintings, furnishings and treasures can be seen in the setting for which they were designed, not as museum objects.

The Historic Buildings, Parks and Gardens Event is held in parallel with the HHA's AGM. HHA members will receive an invitation to the AGM and lunch direct from the HHA.

EDWARD HARLEY
PRESIDENT OF THE HHA

Edward Harley was elected President of the HHA in 2008 having served for five years as Deputy President. He is the owner of the Brampton Bryan Estate in Herefordshire.

The HHA represents Britain's historic houses, castles and gardens in private ownership. There are 1,500 Member houses consisting of listed buildings or designated gardens, usually Grade I or II*. Many HHA houses feature in the minds of the public as symbols of Britain's unique heritage. Around 500 HHA houses and gardens are open to the public, attracting some 15 million visitors each year.

THE MARQUESS OF DOURO

The eldest son of the eighth Duke of Wellington, Lord Douro and his wife live at Stratfield Saye House in Hampshire and at Apsley House in London. Stratfield Saye was built by the Pitt family in the 1630s. The Estate was acquired in 1818 by the Trustees of the first Duke of Wellington with the intention of building a palace to rival Blenheim. In the end, the existing house was retained and somewhat enlarged. Apsley House was built in the 1770s by the architect Robert Adam for Lord Apsley who subsequently became Lord Bathurst. His son sold the house in 1807 to the Marquess Wellesley, elder brother of the first Duke of Wellington. In 1818 Wellington bought the house from his brother as his London residence. During the years 1828-1830, while he served as Prime Minister and lived at Downing Street, the house was considerably enlarged and faced in stone. In 1947, the seventh Duke of Wellington presented the house and its most important contents to the Nation, but retained approximately half the house as a private residence for the family.
