Friday 23 September 2011

The objective of the Government's Localism Bill is to empower local communities and encourage volunteers to play an increasing role in improving their local areas. It offers scope for decision-making at the lowest practical level, shifting power from central government into the hands of individuals, communities and local authorities. This, it is maintained, will enable greater innovation and deliver better value for taxpayers' money.

Combined with public expenditure cuts and the Government's vision for the 'Big Society', the movement towards localism represents the largest potential shake-up of the planning system for many years. How will this affect the historic environment?

So far the focus of the heritage sector has been to counter perceived threats to historic buildings by allowing local planning procedures to override national cultural priorities.

This conference will look beyond current conflicts, and explore the ways in which local initiatives might unlock the potential for the historic environment to play a greater role in shaping the future of towns and villages.

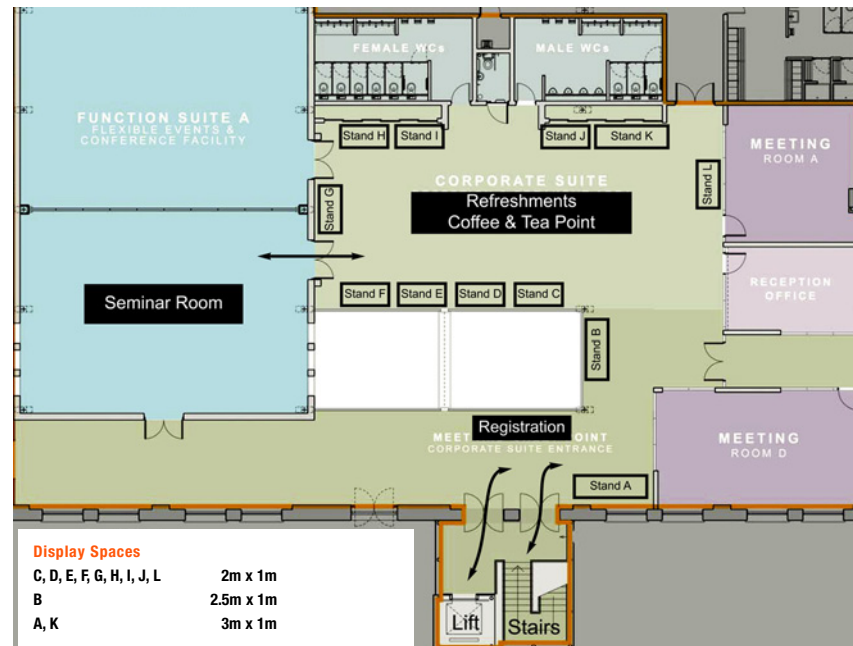
