
The High Sheriff

- ◆ To work with organisations involved with young people, in particular through the Association's charity, National Crimebeat which encourages young people between the ages of 5 and 25 to help create safer communities in which to live
- ♦ In accordance with the Criminal Law Act 1826, to make monetary awards to those, who in the opinion of the Judges at a criminal trial, have been active in the apprehension of certain offenders
- ◆ Since February 2004, as one of the two royal appointees in each county of England and Wales, participation in the recently established Citizenship Ceremonies at which new Citizens make an oath of allegiance to the Queen and receive their Certificate of Citizenship
